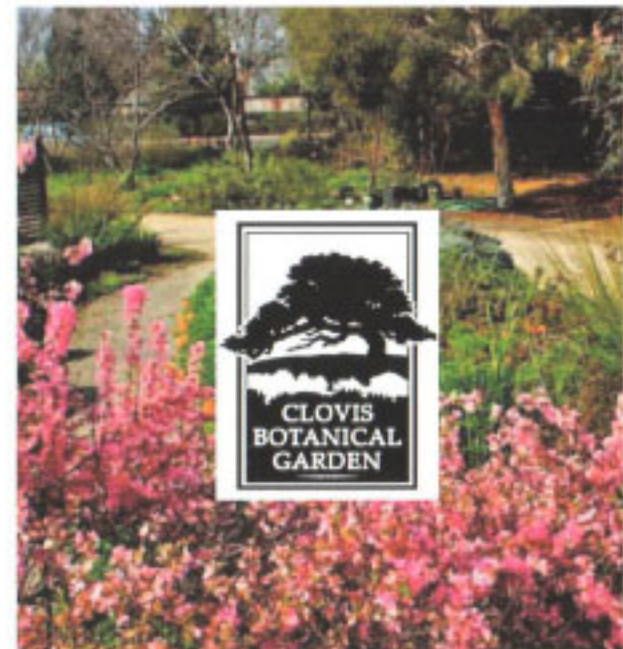

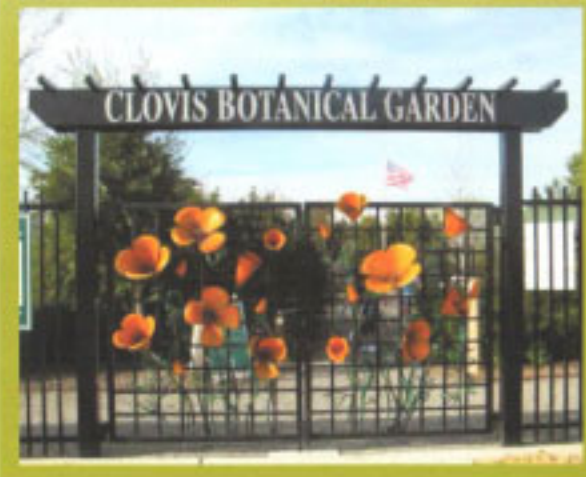

HISTORY

In 1993, the Clovis Botanical Garden grew out of an idea of Clovis citizen Gordon Russell. Inspiration for the garden came from Russell's visits to other botanical gardens and realization that no such project existed in the San Joaquin Valley. It was Russell's vision to establish the Clovis Botanical Garden as an educational outlet for the community with emphasis on water conservation and horticulture appropriate to the Valley climate.

The Clovis Botanical Garden is a one-acre water-wise demonstration garden and provides beautiful plants and landscapes appropriate for the hot summers and cool winters of California's Central Valley. It is on land owned by the City of Clovis, bordered by a bike trail and the Dry Creek Park.

Our goal: to become the premier regional garden for demonstrating wise water use in Valley landscapes.

Our mission: to promote water conservation in the Central Valley by developing gardens, programs, and exhibits to inspire and educate the public.

Our future: to add 3 more acres of attractive trees, shrubs and perennials that thrive in our Mediterranean climate, as well as examples of landscaping materials, irrigation exhibits, and a LEED "green" visitor center and education complex.
